Your arrival

Your parents will likely book your flight to Barcelona for you. In order to organize the transfer for you, your parents have to make sure that they inform us about your flight details at least one week prior to your arrival in Barcelona.

The details we need to know are: Your airline and flight number, the arrival time and the airport you are coming from.

It is always helpful if you also let us know your details for your flight back, so that we can already organize your return transfer for you.

If you are travelling with your parents, and therefore do not need a transfer, please let us know what time you will be at your accommodation. We need to know the approximate time so that we can inform your group leaders/host family.

Important information!

While booking your flight, please remember that the arrival in Barcelona is always on a Sunday and departure on a Saturday!

You should also make sure that your arrival and departure time in Barcelona is between 09:00 am and 08:00 pm!

Unaccompanied minors

Should your parents have booked the service for unaccompanied minors with the airline, please note that we have to be informed about this at least two weeks prior to your arrival in Barcelona! As soon as we have the information we will let you know the name of the person that will meet you at the airport. Your parents will then have to give that name to the airline. Please understand that we are unable to organize this special transfer, should we receive the information later than two weeks prior your arrival. We can only offer this service if the unaccompanied minor service is required by the airline.

Important information!

**Please note that we only offer unaccompanied minor service if the airline requires it:
Surcharge = 150 € one way.**



Arrival in Barcelona – Transfer

After landing in Barcelona you will go through customs and take your luggage from the baggage claim. The baggage claim will show your flight number and your destination of origin. As soon as you have found your luggage, please go to the exit which will take you to the arrivals hall of the airport.

You will meet the group leader/driver who will take you to your accommodation in the arrivals hall. He will hold a "Sprachcaffe-sign", "Barcelona Plus-sign" or a sign with your name on it, which you should look out for. (see next page)

Should you not see the group leader/driver immediately, please don't panic! It is very well possible that the group leader/driver might be a few minutes late due to traffic conditions. Please just wait in the arrival hall and keep on looking for the "Sprachcaffe-sign", "Barcelona Plus-sign" or "your name-sign".

Important information!

Should you not have met the driver after 15 minutes of waiting, please call the following phone number: 0034-628 713 715

Once you have met the group leader/driver you might have to wait a while for other students arriving. The group leader/driver will tell you if this is the case or not. The group leader/driver will then take you to the residence or host family, depending on what type of accommodation you have booked.

Arrival Information for Barcelona

General Information:


If you booked a transfer, there will be someone waiting for you in the airport.
In a normal situation, there will be a teamer or one of our drivers waiting for you. However, you should have your transfer information, address and important phone numbers with you:

If there is any important change (flight cancelled, missed flight, flight delay or lost luggage etc.), please let us know as soon as possible.

After arrival:

As soon as you go through the door, there will be two possibilities to leave: right or left. In any case, there will be a teamer waiting for you behind the first line of people and in front of the Caffè di Fiore, where other shuttle drivers will be waiting for their clients. Remember: Our teamers/drivers will be holding a "Sprachcaffe-sign" or "Barcelona Plus-sign" or "your name-sign".



Your Luggage

You should check with your airline how much luggage you are allowed to take. Normally you are allowed to take 20kg plus one piece of hand luggage. While packing, please remember that you will have to carry your suitcase as well.

Important information!

You should always have a luggage tag on your suitcase and hand luggage!

In your **suitcase** you should bring

- ✓ Clothes
- ✓ Umbrella
- ✓ Beach towel
- ✓ Bath towels

In your **hand luggage** you should bring

- ✓ Your passport or ID card
- ✓ Visa (if necessary)
- ✓ Your flight ticket or E-ticket-number
- ✓ Your Voucher with all important information/emergency numbers
- ✓ Important pharmaceuticals (+ confirmation from your doctor to take them on the plane)
- ✓ Health insurance documents
- ✓ Contact details of your parents
- ✓ Pocket money
- ~~✓ Pillow to sleep on the plane~~

Important information!

Money or traveler checks should never be kept in your luggage!

Visa and Entry Conditions

As Spain is a member of the EU, EU nationals can enter the country with a valid passport or ID card. Non-EU nationals should check visa and entry requirements at the Spanish Embassy.

Accommodation

You will most probably find many differences in the way of living in Spain if you compare it to your home country. Usually the furnishing, the division of buildings and the cleanliness will be different than in your home country. The rooms in Spain are usually smaller so that there will generally only be a bed, a table and a wardrobe in your room. If you stay at a host family you will probably share the bathroom or with your hosts and other students. Please make sure that you always leave your room and bathroom clean and tidy and that you do not damage the furniture. You will get bed-linen, but you will have to bring towels yourself.

In general, the families will introduce you to their habits on the day of your arrival, such as: general rules, the handing over of the key, times for meals, showers etc. Usually one shower per day is allowed, please ask your family if you want to take a shower more often. Please also take the family into consideration and avoid unnecessary noise, especially late in the evening and at night. If you are not home for a meal, please let your host family know. Please note that you are not allowed to cook for yourself in the host family's kitchen.

In the residence you will get bed-linen and towels which will be changed twice a week, so you do not have to bring any yourself. But don't forget to bring a beach towel!

The residence PERE FELIP MONLAU is located in 10/15 minutes walking distance from our school. You will be accommodated in double rooms with bunk bed and bathroom en-suite. The rooms will be cleaned twice a week, please try to keep it clean and tidy yourself. Wifi will be provided in common areas and rooms.

Important: you will be given a key or a card in order to lock and open your room in case you lost it you should forfeit 40€

Please note that we cannot promise that you will be the only student of your nationality in your accommodation or room.

Important information!

Should you have any problems or questions, please contact your group leader! The group leaders are there to help you and they are available at any time!

Meals

„When in Rome do as the Romans do“...In Spain you will probably have adapt a little bit if you are used to a big breakfast. Breakfast in Spain normally consists of milk, coffee and some pastries. You will be given packed lunches, e.g. a sandwich and a drink. As in almost all Mediterranean countries the main meal is in the evening and is served late.

Pocket money

It is difficult to say how much pocket money you should take with you since the amount depends on age and individual habits. The organized leisure program with excursions, sport or parties is already included. Our suggestion is about 150,-EUR pocket money per week. It is best to change your money locally since the exchange rate is usually better. You can also take Prepaid Visa Cards. Please refer to your bank for further information about the Prepaid Visa Cards. We recommend an early application of the Prepaid Visa Cards. You should take a bit of cash for the first few days (e.g. to phone home).

Please note that we will use public transport for some activities which is not included in the package. Everyone should therefore buy a weekly pass for public transport.

Important information!

Our suggestion is to take about 150,- EUR pocket money per week.

We always recommend taking a bit more money with you since it is difficult to transfer money from your home country to the destination of your language course.

1st Day of School

When do I have to be at school? What is the first day going to be like? You're probably asking yourself these questions and to help you prepare for your language travel, we would like to give you an outline of the first day of school.

08:30 -09:30am: Meeting and introduction of the classes for all students, all teachers introduce themselves, if necessary language tests

09:30- 11:00 am: Class

11:00 – 11:15 am: Break

11:15 – 12:45 pm: Class

12:45 _13:00 pm: Break for all (semi-intensive courses are finished)

13:00 – 14:30 pm: Intensive course

3.00 – 5.00 pm: Orientation tour, we introduce you to the destination and to all its characteristics, the teamers explain all details of your language travel, time for you to ask questions

5.00 pm: End of the afternoon activity, free time

8.00 pm: Dinner in your accommodation

Please consider that the schedule can change at short notice!!!

Learning Materials


In the school we provide you books and learning materials but you should take care of them, you should return the book in good conditions, otherwise you should pay 15 €. Every Friday your book will be revised by your team leader.

If you want you can also buy the book for 15 € and continue learning when you come back home.

Golden rules

At the end of this document you can find a list with some rules that help all of us to have a nice stay in Barcelona. It is very important be aware of that in order to have a good fellowship and coexistence in your accommodation.

Helpful information

Health care in Spain

If you get sick while being in Spain, your group leaders will call a doctor for you. For EU members please take with you your Insurance Health Card or the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC); just in case you need medical assistance, it is necessary in Spanish Public Health Service, otherwise you will have to pay the bills in cash. For all students, especially non EU-nationals, health Insurance is mandatory!

Health

You should not drink tap water in Spain. You can use it for cooking, however. Mineral water (mostly still) is sold in bottles of up to 5 liters and is very cheap. Since it can get very hot in summer, don't forget to drink lots of fluids and use a high-factor sun-cream when sunbathing.

Insurance

We recommend taking health and travel insurance with you. If you lose your luggage, if they are damages or valuable items are missing it is always annoying and a reimbursement without insurance is a time-consuming process and not always very successful.

Clothes

It is best to take casual clothes with you. We also recommend packing a warm pullover, as it occasionally can get cold in the evenings. For excursions we recommend a pair of practical shoes. Something a little fancier would also be good for special occasions and for the clubs. Don't forget to pack your swimming things.

Phone

The international code for Spain is **0034**, plus the phone number. If you want to phone to your home country, please check with your parents what the international code for your country is. There are public telephones everywhere in the city. You can buy telephone cards in the shops and at the newspaper stands.

Money

The official currency in Spain is the Euro. Your bank can give you the exact exchange rate. It is usually cheaper to change money in Spain, but we recommend taking a little bit of pocket-money for the first weekend.

Safe

There is no safe at school, so we recommend taking traveler checks. Sprachcaffe cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.

Electricity

220 volts. You might need an adaptor.

Time difference

In Spain they are on Central European Time, CET. Depending on your home country, you might have to change your watch!

Documents

Better to be safe than sorry! Please make a copy of all your important travel documents. For example: flight ticket, insurance policy and passport. In case you lose important documents you can be helped quicker if you have such copies. Please keep the copies separate from the original documents.

Public holidays

Unfortunately classes that fall on public holidays cannot be made up. You will find information about Spain's public holidays in our brochure.

Climate

Barcelona has a Mediterranean climate with mild winters and hot summers. The best time to travel to Barcelona is in May, June and September. In July and August it can get extremely hot with temperatures up to 37°C.

Applied geography

Barcelona

In Barcelona, the second largest city in Spain, there are many museums and cultural centers. In the Barrio Gotico, the Gothic Area, there are many historical monuments to see. The Gothic Cathedral and Bishop's Palace are particularly well-known. The Romans have left their traces here, too. There is 60m tall Columbus Monument at the southern end of the Rambla (pedestrian area) which allows you a wonderful view over the city and the harbour. You also have a good all-round view from the cable-car which goes up to the 200m high hill Montjuic. There is a theme-park and also some museums, amongst others the Fundacion Joan Miró, next to the 1992 Olympic Games Complex. Not far away in the Plaza d'España are some buildings from the time of the World Exhibition in 1929, for example the Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya. As well as many other museums in Barcelona you can also visit the Museu Picasso in the La Ribera area. Don't forget Gaudi's works as well. Gaudi, the most famous Art Deco style architect, has his biggest, and yet unfinished, work here which is the church Sagrada Familia.

Barcelona is well-known for its festivals. On January 5th the procession of the Three Kings takes place. Carnival is celebrated in February with processions and performances by the colles de dracs (young people who set off fireworks). On 3rd March there are celebrations in honour of Sant Medir in the Gràcia part of town.

On April 23rd, International Book Day and name day for Sant Jordi, there are many book stands and rose-sellers in Barcelona. In June on Corpus Christi there are a lot of processions with huge figures, the gigantes and cabezudos. The summer equinox is celebrated on the eve of Sant Joan's name day (June 23rd) with fires in the streets and in the squares. The streets in the Gràcia area are decorated on Assumption Day (August 15th). The day of celebration for the Virgen de la Merced, the protecting patron of Barcelona, is happily celebrated on September 24th. There are musical performances, processions with huge figures, performances by the colles de drac, cultural performances, sports events and fun-fairs four four days.

The well-known 'strolling mile' Rambla is only a few minutes on foot from the school. This street which is a pedestrian area runs for over a kilometer from the big Plaza de Catalunya to the sea. With its various cafes, shops, souvenir shops and street artists it is a permanently lively area. Discos and music bars are found in between the streets Pau Claris and Aribau on the axis Diagonal, as well as in the Aribau and Muntaner streets. At the harbour you will find the famous Maremagnum shopping centre. There are also an aquarium, a cinema and other leisure activities to offer.

Excursions

If you are staying for two weeks one full day and two half day excursion are included in the price already. If you are staying for three weeks you will be taking part in two full day trips and three half day trips. The trips will take you to the following places for example:

- ✓ Figueres
- ✓ Girona
- ✓ Costa Brava
- ✓ Tarragona

Please note that the activities and trips might vary depending on weather conditions and number of students. There are usually also some extra activities offered that you can book for a small fee once you are in Barcelona.

Supervision

Our teamers supervise the leisure program. Please consider that Sprachcaffe Languages Plus is only responsible for students while supervised during leisure program. We expect you to behave in a respectful way and we are not responsible if you do not respect the rules or act at your own risk.



Return trip

On your departure our transfer will take you to the airport. You will be informed about the pick-up time by your group leader. Please make sure you tell your group leaders your flight details a few days before you are going home so that the transfer can be organized accordingly

Normally there will be no group leader going to the airport with you. Our driver will drop you off in front of the right departure terminal.

Please note! We do not have a check-in-service!

You will go into the terminal and walk to the check-in counter. Which one you need to go to will be shown on the screen in the terminal. You should check in about 2 hours before your flight departs. After that please go through security straight away, because especially during high season this can take a while.

Meals for your return journey

We would like to inform you that you need to cater for yourself on your return journey. The last meal in your accommodation will usually be breakfast. Please make sure you have enough pocket money left on the last day so you can buy some food.

U20 Rules and Regulations

General rules

1. Alcohol: U20 students are not allowed to buy or drink alcohol.

Addition for Malta: According to Maltese law, students over 17 years are allowed to drink beer, wine and sparkling wine within reasonable limits.
2. Smoking: Students under the age of 18 on the U20 programme are not allowed to smoke. Students older than 18 are encouraged not to smoke in the presence of other U20 students.
3. Drugs: Drugs are strictly forbidden. Students found to be in possession of drugs will be sent home at their own expense immediately.
4. Violence/Stealing: If students are violent towards staff, other students, host families or anyone else Sprachcaffe reserves the right to send them home on their own cost. The same applies to stealing.
5. Warning: If students do not obey the rules the Teamer Coordinator can give them an official warning, which also means that their parents will be informed about the misbehavior. After the third official warning Sprachcaffe reserves the right to send the student home at their own expense.
6. Free time: U20 students are allowed to be without a Teamer in their free time, but never alone. They should be in groups of at least two students. Furthermore, U20 students are not allowed to organize any trips for themselves or to leave the destination even with the permission of their parents.
7. Hitchhiking: Hitchhiking is not allowed for safety reasons.
8. Swimming: Swimming is allowed if students can swim, but is at the students' own risk. Unless informed otherwise, it will be assumed that students are able to swim. We would like to highlight that swimming is not an organized activity and that Sprachcaffe cannot take responsibility for students while swimming.
9. Law: The local law of the country students are studying in has always to be respected and followed.
10. Adult students: Students from 18 years on should follow the rules unless they have our permission, otherwise we will recommend them to take part in the adult program.
11. Responsibility: Sprachcaffe Languages Plus is only responsible for students while they are supervised during the leisure programme. If students do not respect the rules Sprachcaffe Languages Plus will not be responsible for any problems or accidents occurring.

School

12. Attendance: Taking part in lessons and the daily information meetings with the Teamers is mandatory.
13. Punctuality: We expect the students to be on time for their lessons. If students are late or not able to come to the lessons for any other reason, they need to inform their Teamers.
14. Mobiles: The use of mobiles during classes and information meetings is not allowed.
15. Food and drinks: Food and drinks (except for water) are not allowed during lessons.



16. Tidiness at school: We expect the U20 students to help us keeping the school tidy and use the bins and not to leave empty bags, packets, food, bottles or any other items in the student rooms or around the school.

Accommodation

17. Tidiness at home: Host families are not hotels. We therefore ask every student to make his bed and keep his bedroom clean and tidy.
18. Communication with the host family: We expect the U20 students to let their host family know when they will be back from the leisure activities and to inform if they will arrive later for dinner.
19. Rules of the host family: Students also need to respect the rules of their host family.
20. Noise: At the residences students should respect their fellow guests and not cause any disturbance or loud noise after 10pm.
21. Curfew: Students can go out until 11pm. After this all students need to be back at their host families and in the residences. On Friday & Saturday they will be able to go out until 1 am if a team leader accompanies them. The curfew does not apply for U20 events organised by the Sprachcaffe team, which can occasionally finish later. Group leaders have the right to adjust the curfew according to external circumstances.
22. Damage: If students cause any damage to the residence or at the host family, Sprachcaffe will ask the student's parents to refund the costs of the damage.
23. Accommodation: Boys and Girls will be accommodated separately.

Should a student break the U20 rules or the laws of the host country, Sprachcaffe is entitled to send the student home at their own expense immediately.
